Agri-Food

Responsible for growing 12% of England's food and processing 70% of its fish, growth in the agri-food sector in Greater Lincolnshire is important not only locally, but for the whole of the UK. The agri-food sector employs over 75,000 workers in wide range of businesses.




Green Jobs
