

# **ESOL Tip Sheet**



## Superlative Forms #3

We have already looked at how to make superlative forms with one-syllable and two- (or more) syllable adjectives. (**Tip Sheet Superlative Forms #1 & #2).** 

e.g. the hottest

the largest

the noisiest

the most interesting

Now we are going to look at some special superlatives that have no rules (we call these **irregular**).

Because there are no rules for these, you will have to remember them!

#### Irregular adjectives - superlatives

good – the best

bad - the worst

little (amount) - the least

many – the most

much – the most

far - the furthest or the farthest

ill - the worst

#### Sam has the most money, Alex has the least.













### **Special superlatives**

With some adjectives-superlatives, we can use -est OR the most:

- ✓ quiet the quietest / the most quiet
- ✓ clever the cleverest / the most clever
- ✓ narrow the narrowest / the most narrow
- √ simple the simplest / the most simple
