### Supporting Your Child with Learning at Home

Our 12-week course which covers the importance of self-care; practical ways to support overcoming challenges to parenting; developing boundaries; ideas how to build a child's self-esteem when working at home and how to cope with resistance. This course helps parents/carers support their child's development with fun, learning opportunities, promoting confidence, creativity and enjoyment.

### Let's Talk for EAL Parents and Carers

Over 6 weeks our tutors will support EAL parents in understanding how their child develops English as a second language in an immersive culture. It will cover the basic vocabulary/phrases to help a child settle in to the classroom more quickly and practical suggestions and activities for language and speech development.

# What's it all about?



Our team of qualified tutors deliver a range of courses in schools across the county. The 2-hour sessions are planned to be flexible, friendly and fun.

Our courses support your aims for parents, carers grandparents to be more engaged with their children's learning, offers ideas of how to support with home learning or help them begin their own personal learning journey. Our tutor will work with you to plan a Family Learning course that suits your school's needs.

For the first hour our tutor works with the parents to teach activities that support learning, while the link teacher from the school works with their children. During the second hour of joint learning the link teacher leads the interactive teaching with parents and their children, supported by the tutor.
